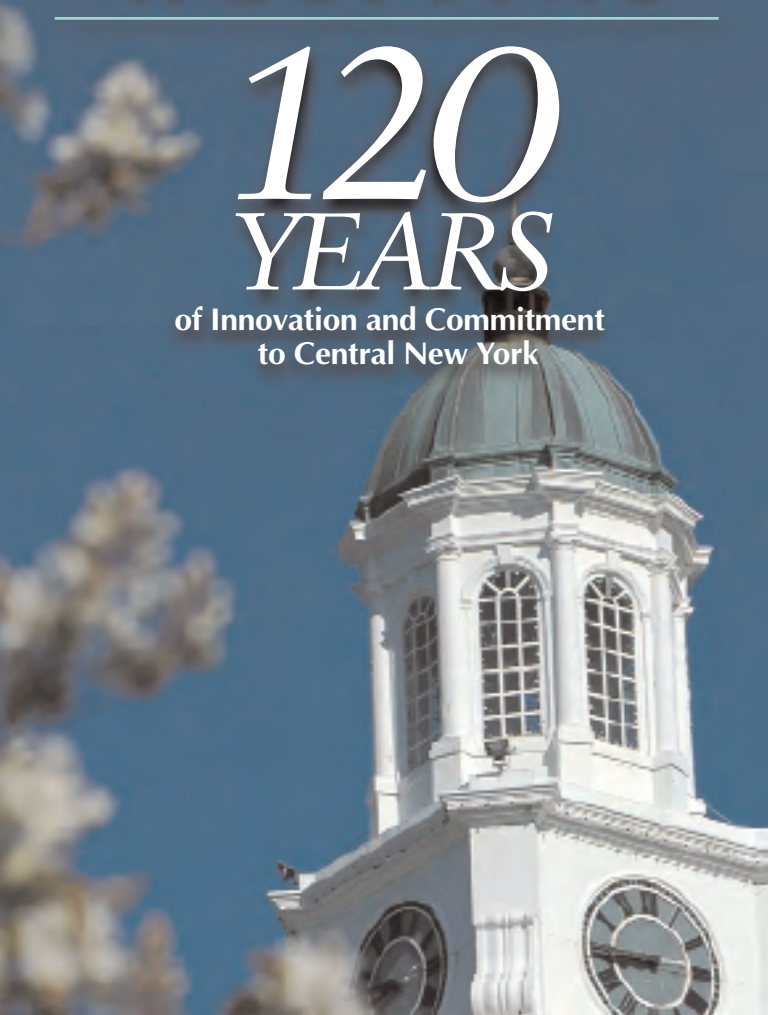

Architects of Memorial Hospital: Dwight James Baum & John Russell Pope **Steven Bedford, PhD**

The most recognizable landmark of the current physical plant at Crouse Hospital is the Memorial Tower, opened in 1929. American colonial forms often inspired architects Pope and Baum. They would go on to design Syracuse University's distinctive Hendricks Chapel, and Pope's plan was selected in 1936 for the famous Jefferson Memorial in Washington, D.C. This talk will explore their work and partnership.
