78 Years Ago: On Feb. 3, 1939, a fire broke out in the Collins Block on East Genesee Street between the State **Tower and Courier** buildings. The flames had been brought under control when part of the building suddenly collapsed, trapping beneath the rubble some firemen who were on the third floor of the building. A total of nine firemen died as a result, making it the deadliest fire in Syracuse's history. Every year on the anniversary of the Collins Block Fire, a ceremony is held in Fayette Firefighters Memorial Park to honor all of the firemen killed in the line of duty while serving the citizens of Syracuse. – Dan Connors for the Onondaga Historical Association
