

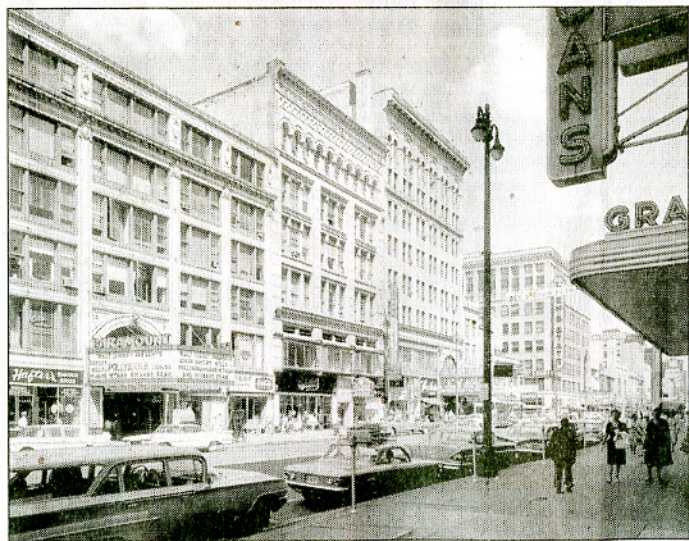
OHA photos bring era to life
