

OHA AT 150**Death of the son of a future president**

The Onondaga Historical Association is celebrating its 150th anniversary. Here's what was going on in 1863:

Charles Johnson, a surgeon in the Union Army, dies from injuries sustained after being thrown from a horse. He was the oldest son of Andrew Johnson, who was the military governor of Tennessee at the time, and would become president of the United States two years later.
