Abraham Lincoln gave his famous speech at the dedication of the National Cemetery in Gettysburg, Pa. During his talk he had to pause five times for applause. The ceremony started with a procession from the town to the cemetery and included both music and a two-hour speech by the featured orator, Edward Everett. A crowd of 15,000 people witnessed the day's proceedings.
