Complete with historical stories, evidence and some "would-be" evidence, Pari does a great job of presenting an honest and respectful retrospective piece on contacting the other side.

Filled with anecdotal tales from his travels and evidence from his investigations, this lecture is just the right mix of educational, fun and creepy.
