Skä·noñh center hosts program about Indigenous resistance

The Skä·noñh — Great Law of Peace Center in Liverpool is hosting an exercise by the Neighbors of Onondaga Nation (NOON) on Dec. 13 called "Witness to Injustice: Unraveling U.S. and Indigenous History," adapted from the KAIROS Blanket Exercise.

This is a two-hour interactive group exercise that invites participants to experience colonization, conquest and attempted genocide of the Indigenous Peoples of Turtle Island (the North American Continent).

Witness to Injustice is a participatory exercise designed to raise awareness of European conquest and Indigenous resistance and survival through the use of meaningful quotes and blankets representing the lands of Turtle Island.

Participants engage in an experiential history lesson designed in a way that can't be provided by reading a book. To participate in this rich group exercise you will need to reserve a spot, and it will cost \$12 per participant. There is a maximum of 35 people for this group exercise. It will be from 6 to 8:30 p.m. Dec. 13.
